## Ice is coming to a rink near you

How do those lovely sheets of smooth ice appear at our community league rinks each winter? It takes effort and time of volunteer ice makers who diligently step into the cold to sweep off the snow and flood the area with water.

Temperature plays a big part in when you can and cannot flood the ice. Spruce Avenue ice maker, Henry Stainthorp, explains that if it is too cold outside, the freshly sprayed water won't bond to the old ice, causing it to crack. (The ideal temperature for flooding is around minus 10 degrees.) Stainthorp worked for Edmonton Northlands for 37 years as a professional ice

maker—he made ice for most of the Oilers games in that time including the five Stanley Cup games they won. He has also made ice for the Tim Hortons Brier and the Canada Cup.

You can see the ice-making process for yourself in the photos on this page. Our community has some great opportunities for skating, so get out and enjoy the ice this winter!








He is perhaps the hardest working photographer I know, always shooting and experimenting, always evaluating and pushing past any barriers that might try and contain him. Bob follows in these rich photographic traditions to remind us that we all have to face the bad with the good; but that in the end it truly is, a wonderful life.

## About the book *It's a Wonderful Life*

BY BOB TODRICK

History has always been recorded in part by the journals and artwork left behind by people and often their family histories. In the 20th and 21st centuries, the journal became a lost art, replaced by the family photograph.

I struggled in the making of this book. As a photographer, I've always worked toward the singular image that can be hung on someone's wall. Five years ago, when I first thought about doing a book, I immediately felt it would be a collection of these pieces of art. But as the last five years passed, and my work was shown in galleries and published in books, I came to realize that the most important work, the work I would most want to hand down to my children and friends, were the photographs I made of them, the world around us and our history. It is the story of my life, and it's a wonderful life.









When I finally moved to Norwood, I found even more to love. The week I moved in, three of my neighbours came to introduce themselves. I feel so blessed to live here.




I now know all of my neighbours in a ten-house stretch and know many of the people who walk their dogs, who walk to work and to school.


